If she should not I give her power of making an equal division thereof (the Land excepted) among all my children and in default of such division I leave the same at my said wife's death to be equally divided among all my children to them and their heirs forever. And I do hereby appoint my sons John Jackson and Jethro Jackson my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of December One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Seven

unto my two sons Littleberry and Jock the tract of Land on which I now
live to be equally divided between them on the death of Dearly beloved wife
Siller. Item I lend unto my Dearly beloved wife during her life the Tract
of land given as above to my two sons. Item I lend unto my Dearly
beloved wife wife Siller during her life all the rest of my estate and at her
death it is my will and desire that it be equally divided among my then
surviving children. Item it is my will & desire that if either of my
children should loose the Negro I have given him before he shall get the
negro in possession that in that case my Executors shall make good the
loss of the 2^d Negro the said Child at the death of my wife Siller out of
