In the Name of God Amen I Macarinas Moore
being weak in body do make this as my last Will & Testament
First I desire that all my just Debts be paid out of my Estate.
Secondly, I give to my Sons Mark & James Moore seven pounds
each to discharge their Bond for the hire of a Steers that
lived with me last year. Thirdly I leave the remnant of my
Estate to be equally divided by my Executor between my two
youngest Children namely Polly and Jesse Moore. Fourthly
I appoint Edward Dromgole to execute this my last Will
and Testament signed this 30 day of Jan^y 1799 -

This last Will and Testament of Macarinas Moore
was proved by the Oath of Benjamin Britton one of the
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on
the motion of Edward Dromgole the Executor therein
named he having made Oath thereto according to Law and
together with Ira Ellis his security entered into and acknowledged
a bond in the penalty of Five hundred Dollars with Condition
as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probate thereof in due form.

In the Name of God Amen I William Hesketh
of the County of Brunswick and State of Virginia being weak of
body knowing it is appointed for all men to die and come to judgment, &
as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
in this life I bestow in manner and form as follows - Item I bequeath unto
my wife Elizabeth Hesketh her natural life the Land & plantation whereon
I now live also one Gray Mare one Bed and furniture four Cows & calves twelve
Sheep fourteen Geese one Bar & crans three Basins three dishes six plates four
Jugs one bowl one mug one Butter pot nine Hags one Teat pail & pigen
ten hens, one hen one plough three and a half all the Cotton wool & spinnings

one Hummer about two paces better than one poor flat from the house
and forke also one Negro woman named Teller. Item I give unto
my Daughter Mary Huskey one Bed & furniture also I give her one
Negro Girl named Betty to her and her heirs for ever. Item, I
give unto my Son James Huskey after my wife's death the Land
and plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs for ever
Item, my will and desire is that the rest of my estate after my
death be sold and Equally divided between all of my Children
except my son James Huskey, and also my desire and will is
that what I have lent my wife after her death be sold &
divided in manner as above directed the same I give to them
and their heirs for ever. Item, I appoint my sons Lewis & James
Huskey Executors of this my last Will and Testament ap-
=nalling all other will or wills heretofore made. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this
Nineteenth day of March, one thousand seven hundred & nine-
=ty nine
