to dye do hereby make this my last Will & Testament Viz. first of
all I give unto my Daughter Ann Prince one Dollar 2nd I give unto
my Daughter Amy Brumble one Dollar 3rd I give unto the heir of the
body of my Daughter Elizabeth lands one Dollar 4th I give unto my
Daughter Delilah Morely ten Dollars 5th I give unto my Daughter
Lydia Morely Ten Dollars 6th I give unto my son Clement Morely one
Dollar 7th I give unto my son Taph Morely one Dollar 8th I give unto
my son Shadrach Morely Ten Dollars all to be raised out of my estate agreeable
to the discretion of my Executors 9th I give to my son Nicholas Morely
Eighty Acres of the Lands I now live on to be taken at the West end of
the tract adjoining the line formerly called Stones Lintchins & the heirs of his
body forever 10th I lend unto my wife Jane Morely all the remainder of my land
& plantation during her widowhood or life except the profits of the Orchard
which I desire that my son Nicholas Morely and the five younger Sons
Viz. Manfess Morely, Mabel Morely, Natural Morely, Asenath Morely and
Thursay Morely may have their equal part as long as their mother should
possess the same or they should do their part to keep the orchard in repair &
after my wife marriage or death my desire is that the land left on may be
equally divided between the five youngest Sons last above mentioned and should
be done by Arbitrators I lend unto my wife Jane, also all my slaves with all the
rest of my property that I possess during her life or widowhood and after her
Marriage or death to be equally divided between my son Nicholas and
the five younger Sons above mentioned I also appoint my wife Jane Morely
my son Nicholas Morely & John P. James Executor to this my last Will
& Testament testifying & confirming this to be my last & saying all other
heretofore made slight void & acknowledging in presence of us the 28th
January one thousand eight hundred & three
