last Will & Testament. My Soul I commend to God who gave it, in hopes of its happy
resurrection by the merits of my blessed Redeemer my body I leave to be interred in
a decent & Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter men-
tioned. And as to my real Estate it hath pleased God to endow me with I dispose of
in manner & form following. To wit, I give & bequeath to my beloved
Wife Susanna Pritchett six painted Rush bottomed Chairs such Saddle & one pair
ther bed & furniture which I had by her rise all right & title which I may hereafter
have to any part of the Estate devised to her by her Father Richard Burgess
to her & her Heirs forever. Item I give to my beloved wife Susanna Pritchett
after paying my Just Ditts & the Legacies hereafter mentioned, all my personal Estate
including Wares, Jewels, Jewels, Cattle, Hogs &c. during her life and after her
decease I give & bequeath the same to be equally divided among my then sur-
viving Children & their Heirs to them & their Heirs forever. Item I leave unto my
Son John Burgess Davis during his life his present wife Mary like the plantation they
now live on, I have bounded as follows being on the west side of Little Creek and
bounded by a line of water beginning at Sampsons Branch thence up the said
branch to the line, thence South along the said line to the said Creek & after
their Decease I give & bequeath the said Land to my Grandson Sterling Davis
son of Joseph & Mary Davis to him & his Heirs forever. Item I give the remainder
of my Land including the plantation I now live on I leave to my beloved wife
Susanna Pritchett during her life & after her decease I give & bequeath that part
lying on the west side of Little Creek to my Grandson Sterling Davis and
the residue of all my Land I give & bequeath to my Grandson Moses Pritchett
son of Le. Kian Pritchett Jun^r after my wives Death to them & their Heirs forever
Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Anne Pells Ten Shillings to her & her Heirs
forever. Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary Davis Ten Shillings to
her and her Heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Anne Pells
Ten Shillings to her & her Heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my Son Moses
Pritchett Ten shillings to him & his Heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my Son
William Pritchett Ten shillings to him & his Heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby
appoint my beloved Wife Susanna Pritchett Executrix & Drury Burgess Executor
of the my last Will & Testament hereby revoking & making null and void
all former Wills & Testaments by me made In Witness whereof I have

In the Name of God Amen, I Daniel N. of

the County of Brunswick and State of Virginia being in a low State of Health but in perfect mind & memory do make this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally I ^{do} Give unto my dear Beloved Wife Dorothy during her life or widowhood the Negro Girtes, Lucy, James, Nell, Mary & Susan, the Stone plantation Containing all the Land & thereupon on the proper Run of the Pigeon Roost, with as much of the Stock & plantation utensils as she sees cause to keep. I My Will is that my Lands on the east Side of Samuel Moosters Spring to ranch known by the name of Kiddles and Becks, with my Waggon be sold to pay Samuel Ditt

3. I Give unto my Daughter Melly Bonds all the property I lent her after her Marriage, to her & her Heirs for ever.

4. I Give unto my two sons William and Susan all the rest of my Lands to be equally divided between them by two good Men.

5. I Give unto my four youngest Children after my Wife decease all the Tract of Land that I lent to her to be equally divided between them all.

6. I Give unto my two eldest Sons my four youngest Children & my Wife that has not been before mentioned to be equally divided among them with all the property that I lent to my wife & my Land after her Death or Marriage. I also appoint my two eldest Sons William and Susan Executors of my last Will and Testament Ratifying and confirming the same and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
