I Lebulon Lewis of perfect mind and memory, to wit make and
ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner and form to wit
I Give, I Give unto my beloved wife Sandal Lewis during her life the Tract
of Land whereon I now live called and known by the name of Goe's this
Tract together with the following Negroes Tom, Roger, Easter, 29 years and
Lucy and Phelby, also one Black Horse of Cheal two work horses ten
head choice cattle, ten head choice Sheep one half of my stock of Hogs
also the whole of my Household furniture provided my said wife should
never marry, but should she marry I then leave her only one third part of
my Household furniture my further desire is that my wife shall have her
own grounds to all free during her life, ^{and} or widowhood I give unto my said
wife forty pounds cash. I Give and bequeath, to my beloved son
Benjamin Lewis the Tract of Land whereon he now lives to be divided
from my Tract by the following boundary beginning on John Goe's line at
Moses Creek thence up the said creek to a branch thence up the branch
to a marked tree at the corner of Benjamin Lewis's fence thence a
straight line to the ford between my House and Benjamin Lewis's house
thence up the branch to Benjamin Lewis's Land near the muster fields
I further give to my ^{son} all my land on Stony Creek I also give to
my said son the Gallance of my stock of Horses, cattle, Sheep and Hogs
not herein disposed of also all my crop that may be on hand at my
death I bequeath to my said son

of my Estate both real and personal not herein disposed of to hold the same
 for his sole use and benefit untill his oldest son comes of the age
 of twenty one years then I give and bequeath such Estate to be
 equally divided between all my Grand children then living and
 when his said Oldest son shall have come to the age of twenty
 one years shall be put in possession of his proportion of the said
 estate and the other proportions belonging to the other Grand chil-
 dren shall be held by my said son for his use and benefit
 and shall be delivered up to ^{cash} them when they shall arrive at
 the age of twenty one years or shall marry I do also lend to my
 said son the Benjamin Lewis my mill during his natural life
 and at his death, I give the said Mill to my two Grand sons
 Nicolas E. Lewis and Edwin Lewis to them and their heirs forever.
 Item I give unto my grandson Nicolas E. Lewis all that part
 and parcel of Land belonging to me on the west side of Shining
 Creek, not herein before disposed of. Item I give unto my Grand
 son Edwin Lewis, the Tract of Land whereon I now live bounded
 as follows beginning at a poplar tree on Robert Morris line
 thence along the said Morris line to John Gees line thence
 along the said Gees line to Morris Creek thence along Benja-
 Lewis line, Mitchell's line Howards line Williams line to
 Shining Creek thence down the said Creek to the beginning.
 I also give my said Grand son my Still when he shall arrive
 at the age of twenty one years to him & his heirs forever. Item,
 I give my Grand daughter Lucy Lewis one hundred pounds
 in cash which my son is to keep untill she arrives of age or
 marry and then to be delivered her by my said son. Item I
 give to my Grand daughter Elisabeth Sandal Lewis one hundred
 pounds in cash to be kept and delivered in the same manner
 by my son when she shall arrive of age or marry. Item I give
 unto Elisabeth Lewis thirty pounds cash. Item I give to Polly
 Lewis twenty five pounds cash. Item I give to Mary Lewis
 twenty five pounds cash.

and the legacies herebefore mentioned which said money & debts shall
 taken by my son Benjamin Lewis and said out in Lands which
 be equally divided between the said Henry & Zebulon Lewis this I
 to them and their heirs forever I do hereby constitute and appoint
 Benjamin Lewis, John Organ and Nicolas Edmunds Executors of this
 last will and Testament, revoking and disannulling all former wills by
