James a widow daughter of David Tracy proved at the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October last  
by the Oaths of Wm. Tracy. Noted a widow daughter the same is directed to be  
executed.

Attest Alexander Simondis of Brunswick County being sick but  
possessing a strong mind & memory & willing to meet that it is appointed for all  
men here to die, so firmly fixt in my Mortality every as the manner of man as  
follows This is the first place where that many just debts may be discharged  
as soon as possible There begins unto my beloved wife James a Master Simondis & to  
the child that my wife may now be pregnant with the following negroes to me  
Personal, Springfield, Tracy, Mariah, Nancy, Charly, Melly, Lucy, Valentine and  
three future slaves, who all that part of the plantation which now lies  
lying on the West side of the River that lies from the plantation  
whereas about 1000 acres formerly laid to the plantation in which

August 18th 1806 I formerly bind also me Mahogany Oak to be equally divided  
 between my Child or Children whenever they come of age or marry to their others  
 living before them I bind unto my beloved wife Susan Sundie during her natural  
 life the other half of the plantation from her own living on the east side of the  
 Road as above mentioned also all the Household & Kitchen furniture the plantation  
 Utensils & stock of all kind with the following negroes to wit, Ser. & John Harry  
 Anna & Harris with their future increase & if my Child or Children should die  
 before they come of age or marry I then give & bequeath the above named property  
 to my wife Susan Sundie & her own surviving Son or Daughter only child,  
 or children should die before they come of age or marry I then give & bequeath the  
 the property left my said Child or Children to my brother George Sundie  
 to have & his heirs forever except the negroes last mentioned which I do not  
 intend that this gift to my brother shall in any way affect them nor  
 will it affect what all my estate may be kept together by my self for the  
 benefit of my said wife & children until my said wife or children are  
 of an age to take their inheritance & appoint their attorney & it may  
 be best execution of this my last will & testament in case nothing else can be done  
 with respect thereto if no attorney can be found I do hereby nominate Mr. John E. G.  
 Coffey my seal this twentieth day of August A.D. thousand eight hundred & six  
 witness whereon,
