 road as a board mentioned also all the household & kitchen furniture the plantation
 utensils & stocks of all kinds with the following Negroes to wit, her below Fanny
 Annica & Harris with their future increase & if my child or children should die
 before they come of age or marry then good I bequeath the above named Negroes
 to my wife Susan Lundie & her own surviving issue if there is no issue only child
 or children should die before they come of age or marry I then give & bequeath
 the property left my said child or children to my brother George Lundie
 to him & his heirs forever except the negroes last named which I do not
 intend that they go to my brother shall in any way affect them nor
 will & desire is that all my estate may be kept together in my own life for the
 benefit of my said wife & child or children until my said child or children be
 of an age to bear their own share & appoint John Cotton & Thomas
 Mathew executor of this my last will & testament & charge with the same
 being together in my own person & otherwise as I have directed in my
 will & desire is that this be the day of the last and their own right and do so to
