Well Brunswick being at present in a low state of health but of sound & disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form that is to say in the first place I devise all my last debts and funeral expenses to be first paid, I give my wearing apparel to Sally Larice Golly. I give and bequeath unto Nancy Rawlings daughter of my sister Mary Rawling if alive to receive it, if not then to her sister Elizabeth Rawling all my estate of whatsoever nature or quality it may be & all the monies that is now due me except the parts or proportion I may be entitled to of John Gells estate son of my sister Susanna Gells who from the length of time he has been absent from this County it is presumed is dead, which proportion if it is ever returned I give to the children of Amos Hill but should the same John Gells ever return I request & direct that the same should be returned to him not withstanding any Law may have vested the rights in me, & it is also understood that in case I should name my proportion of the said John Gells estate in my last will and should die without removing this will that the gift to the
