Item the 2nd I give & bequeath to my son John Henshaw Foster one father bed which he has in possession Item the 3rd I give & bequeath to my son William Foster one father bed which he has now in possession Item the 4th I give & bequeath to my son Peter Nansom Foster one father bed which he has now in possession Item the 5th Also I give & bequeath to all of my other children Susannah Foster, Elizabeth Foster, Beverly Foster & Samuel Foster each one a father bed as they can or care out of the family Item the 6th I leave to my wife Elizabeth Foster during her life or widowhood all of my remaining property and at her death or at the expiration of her widowhood I desire all my estate to be equally divided & given to all my children or their heirs. Only I give & bequeath to my daughter Susannah Foster one share by the name of Nabel extraordinary of it should be due. I also constitute & ordain my wife Elizabeth Foster the Executor of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of November A^d One thousand eight hundred & three

In the name of God amen I Nathaniel Ingram of the County of Brunswick & the parish of Saint Andrews being sound in body mind & memory do hereby testify that it is appointed for all men to die & I make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament and for what wholly good it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with in the life I give & bequeath in the following manner Viz I give

I bequeath unto my son in law wife, my daughter Sarah Ingram, that is John
Ingram wife one Negro Man named Solomon which is in her possession to her & her
three former Sons I give I bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Boring the wife of
John Boring one Negro Girl named Violett with her increase which is in her possession to
her & her three former Sons I give unto my Daughter Mary Thomas one Negro Girl
named Dandrey which is in her possession to her & her three former Sons I give
unto my two Grand children, Charlotte & Gabriel one one Negro woman named Luck &
her increase to them & their heirs forever. But if either of them dies before age or marriage
the survivor shall possess this legacy. And if both dies the legacy shall return to my
children I give I bequeath unto my son Bartholomew Ingram one one Negro Girl
I give unto my daughter Elizabeth West two Negroes named John & Minnie which
is in her possession to her & her three former Sons. But in case she dies without an heir lawfully
begotten of her body that it shall return to my children I give unto my daughter
Suanna Holey, stock furniture & all that she has received I give I bequeath unto my loving
wife Elizabeth Ingram the land plantation whereon I now live together with all the remaining
part of my estate during her life & at her death to be divided as follows for my son
to draw one half share & my two Grand children to draw one share & the balance
to be divided equally amongst my other children except the land whereon I now live
which I give I bequeath unto my son Bartholomew Ingram & to his heirs forever.
I do appoint my son Bartholomew Ingram my son in law James Holey to be my
Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & the seal of this second day of February, one thousand eight hundred & two
