Benjamin Harris of the County of Brunswick do make my last Will & Testament in manner after following that is to say I give to my beloved wife Sally all my estate both real & personal during the term of her Natural life or widowhood to enable her to educate & bring up my children decently & my wife should marry I only give her one third of my land during her Natural life to be paid off so as to include the Childs, when third part of my other estate to dispose of as he pleases I only give to my son David Abraham James attorney land which I have given to my wife during the term of her Natural life or widowhood except my wife is pregnant with a child to be born of a male child and in that case I give all my land to be equally divided between my said son David Abraham James and the child she may now be pregnant with or if it should be a male child I give to my daughter Elizabeth Perry Attorney one hundred fifty pounds out of the money due me by my brother Charles James except my wife is pregnant with a child to be born of a female child and in that case I give the above mentioned one hundred fifty pounds to the said Elizabeth Perry Attorney the said female child which she may be pregnant with to be equally divided between them If I die the rest of my estate not herein before disposed of and the estate had my wife during the term of her Natural life (except the land) shall be equally divided between my said David Abraham James, also said Perry Attorney of the child which my wife may now be pregnant with to be equally divided between them when I have other children and finally I do hereby revoke & annul any former Wills & Testaments I have made of this my last Will & Testament
