

annually so that it shall not be lost or destroyed until my Son John Ogain shall come to the age of twenty one years or marry in either case I then wish him to have possession of all my Land except the part which I have above but my wife Polly Ogain which he is not to possess until her death or marriage. I also give my son John Ogain five hundred Dollars or its value in negroes to him & his heirs forever. I desire that two thirds of my Stock together with two thirds of my household & kitchen furniture & what other of my estate as can be spared be sold in order to discharge my debts likewise to support & educate my children. I also desire my Executors to lay out the money which I have willed to my Children as above in buying negroes only & to hire out said negroes for the benefit of my Children until they shall come to the age of twenty one years or marry in either case. I will that they shall then have possession of their Estate to them & their heirs forever, that part of Estate that Consists of Debt I wish to be paid as soon as possible and the money appropriated as above that is to purchase those negroes for my Children at the death or marriage wife Polly Ogain the property but the shall equal among my Children except the Land Lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Polly Ogain Executor Thomas Adams & Thomas Ogain Executors to this my last will & Testament revoking & disannulling all other Wills heretofore by me made.  one bed furniture Horse bridle & Saddle, which she has had in possession
 Item, I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Harrison fifty Dollars
 to him and his Heirs forever, Item, I lend to my beloved wife Mary
 Harrison the residue of the Tract of Land whereon I now live & plantation
 for her use during her life and at her death the said Land & plantation,
 I give to my son Samuel Harrison also one bed furniture Horse Saddle
 & bridle to him & his Heirs forever, also It is my will and desire that my son
 Samuel Harrison shall have liberty to raise his mill Dam four feet
 higher if he thinks proper without summing a Jury My will & desire
 is that my Estate be not appraised & I leave my loving wife Mary Harrison
 the whole Executing of this my test will & Testament resolving all others by
 me made & being my hand & seal this the nineteenth Day of October

I John Wilson of the County of Brunswick being sick in body, but of sound mind and memory do make the last will and Testament thus to be my last will, and Testament, in manner and form as followeth, Viz: I have unto my Daughter Polly Patience during her life, one Negro woman named Fella, with her Increase, and one Negro Boy named Adam and at her decease I give the said Negro Woman Fella, and said Boy with their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I have unto my Daughter Nancy one Negro Girl named Grace & one Negro Boy named David, during her life and at her decease, I give the said girl & boy & said Boy David, with their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them and their heirs forever, I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Wilson, one Negro woman named Fella, & one Negro Girl named Nancy, to them & their heirs forever, I have unto my Daughter Winifred Wyman, one Negro woman named Fanny & her increase & one Negro Boy named Ned during her life, and at her decease, I give the said Fanny & her increase, & said Boy Ned, to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I give and bequeath to my son Andrew & Wilson one Negro boy named George & one Negro Girl named Anna, also one Feather Bed & furniture one Cow & half one Sow & Pigg to them & their heirs forever, I have unto my Daughter Sally B. Holley, one Negro woman named Fanny, & her increase, one Negro Boy named Stephen, & one Negro Boy named Tom during her life & at her decease, I give the said Negro Woman Fanny, Stephen & Tom & their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I have unto my Daughter Polly H. Lavin (during of her life) one Negro Boy named Wiley, one Negro Girl named Holly, & one Cow & half, one Sow & Pigg and at her decease, I give the said Negro Boy Wiley, & Negro Girl Holly & their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I give and bequeath unto my son John Wilson
