I William Wolfe of Teste am now William Wolfe being
 well sick and weak in body but yet of perfect memory thank God Almighty
 God for it and as life is uncertain and death is certain do make my will
 appoint and ordain this my last will and Testament revoking all former
 Wills made by me that is my body I have to be buried after a formal manner
 and my soul be committed into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and
 as to my worldly Estate do give and bequeath after the following manner viz
 Thus I do leave to my living wife Lucy Wolfe all my Estate both real and
 personal (after raising all my children until they come of age and giving
 each and every of them a tolerable portion of Schooling) during her natural life
 or widowhood and at her death or marriage then it is my will that if my son
 William is not of age that all the Negroes and other property at that time
 belonging to my Estate be kept together on my plantation and the profits
