

In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Coleman of the County
of Brunswick & State of Virginia being in perfect mind & capable to this my
last Will & testament. First I give to my son Benjamin Coleman One Orphan's share to
have & to his heirs forever. Secondly I give to my daughter Mary Coleman One
share of the Negro slaves with their increase viz Annus, Henry, Albert, Molly, Delilah
& Sarah also a tract of land lying in the said County of Brunswick & Parish of
Abbeville called White Plains which will more fully appear by a Deed executed to
me by his father William Coleman which Deed is Recorded in the County Court of the
said County, to have & to his heirs forever. Thirdly I give to my daughter Benjamin
Coleman One Negro viz Douglas to have & to his heirs forever. Fourthly I give
to my Grand Daughter Maria Culley One Two hundred pounds also viz Let
Annam to her & her heirs forever. It is my will that she receive at the age
of twelve she may be allowed the Interest of the money when her money
shall be paid to her.

I solemnly I swear the residue of my Negroes with their increase to my daughter Mary Leach
 which will more fully appear by this my late husband's Willing Edwards's
 Will recorded in the County Court to wit to her four daughters Martha because
 all my property of every description except the negroes shall be sold and
 the money arising therefrom with any money that may be or have been received
 the before with my Grand daughter's money being sold of any business remains
 it shall be paid unto my Grandson Benjamin Edwards Son to said John Leach
 for use He is further my will & mine should either of my Grandchildren die
 before they become of age so however that the property herein therein shall be
 divided equally among the survivors In witness whereof I have hereunto set
 hand my son Benjamin Edwards my Grand daughter Mary Leach of this my last
 Will Testament Witness my hand & seal this twentieth day of February 1774
