George Watten's Will

In the name of God Amen I George Watten of the County of Brunswick being sick & weak but of sound mind and memory do make & declare this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Watten the following slaves Betty, Pith, Sam & Lucy, two Boys & Mary, one Mare & Saddle, one Horse & Furniture all now in her possession to her & heirs forever. I also give unto my son William Watten One tract of land whereon he now lives containing 350 Acres as well to him as also the land & building formerly

One Mare Saddle & bridle two Pans & Calves, one Bed Furniture all now in his
 possession to him & to his heirs forever. *Then* I give unto my son James Brother
 the tract of land lying on the West side of Rolling Run Creek up to Partridge Run
 meeting House Spring, with the tract whither he now lives all except one half
 acre wherein the Meeting House stands & that for the use of the Meeting House.
 One Slave Jane, One hundred fifty pounds, One Horse Saddle & bridle One Pan
 & Calves One Bed Furniture all now in his possession to him this his forever.
Then I give unto my son George Brother one tract of land lying in
 Pennsylvania upon Tommy Newton Creek containing 501 acres whither he
 now lives two slaves, Harney & Simon, two Horses, saddle & bridle one Pan & Calves
 One feather bed & furniture all now in his possession to him this his forever.
Then I give unto my Daughter Catey Sister the following slaves Sarah & Virg
 One feather bed & furniture, these now in her possession Forty five pounds
 to be paid her out of my estate to her & her heirs forever. *Then* I give unto my
 Daughter Nancy Sister the following slaves Calverne & Venus & thirty six
 pounds One Bed Furniture to her & her heirs forever. *Then* I give unto my
 Daughter Jane Sister the following slaves Bob & Henry & thirty six pounds
 One feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever. *Then* I give unto my son John
 Brother when he shall arrive at the age of twenty one or twenty two years
 two young Negro slaves, One Horse Saddle & bridle to him & to his heirs forever. *Then* I give
 unto my son Henry Brother when he arrives at the age of twenty one or twenty
 two years two young Negro slaves, One Horse Saddle & bridle to him & to his heirs forever.
Then I give unto my son Thomas Brother when he shall
 arrive at the age of twenty One year or twenty two years two young Negro slaves One Horse
 Saddle & bridle to him & to his heirs forever. *Then* I
 give unto my beloved wife Catey Sister (after paying my just debts & the legacies
 heretofore mentioned all my land & Negroes together with what personal estate I may
 then have saving her widowhood or life, but if she should marry my Will & mine is
 that she should have only two slaves Harney & Virg one feather bed & furniture
 One Horse Saddle & bridle during her Natural life, after my wife's death or widowhood
 my Will & mine is that my land whither I now live & the land adjoining thereto
 with heretofore mentioned to be equally divided between my son John Brother, Henry
 Brother, & Thomas Brother & the residue of my estate to be equally divided
 between my following children Elizabeth Sister, Jane Sister, Catey
 Sister, & Sarah Sister & the residue of my estate to be equally divided

I Thomas Butler, my Will is such as that my son Johnny Butler & Thomas
Butler shall be redacted out of my estate. I give unto my beloved wife
Patsy Butler one tract of land lying in Thomas Springs Mill Run containing
260 Acres after the land suit shall be determined between Joseph Potts heirs one
of the lands shall then remain mine to his & his heirs forever. Lastly I nominate
& appoint my son William Butler & James Butler executor to this my last Will
& Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my
seal this the twentieth day of May One thousand eight hundred & Six
