In the name of God amen I Henry Dugger of Brunswick County State of Virginia being inform in body but of perfect mind (and memory do ordain this my last will and testament that is to say I give to my Beloved Son James Dugger one Dollar then I give to my beloved Daughter Sally Shall one Dollar then I give to my Beloved son Henry Dugger one half of my logs then I give to my beloved Daughter Rebecca Dugger all the residue of my estate I also appoint my son James Dugger to be my Executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of July Eighteen hundred and five

In the name of God amen I Cartor Harrison of Brunswick County Virginia, being in my perfect health, (and sound memory) do in consequence of my intending to travel to sun dry parts of the Continent of America (and my return - being unsafe - or doubtful) do in the first place give and bequeath the my self to my wife her who first give me existence - (and after my body be decently buried, should be Interred - in the place of my death to be convenient in a Christian manner & as my will and desire the following mentioned property, to wit: I bequeath to my two Brothers namely, James Harrison, and Benjamin Harrison my interest in the Land purchased of the Estate of my Father, James Harrison dec'd situated in Brunswick County, Meherrin Parish, also my Negro Man Will, three head of Horses, stock of Cattle Hogs and all the money arising from the depending debts, finally I give all visible species of property interest and profits arising from any resource of mine whatsoever, to be equally divided between the said James Harrison and Benjamin Harrison and I do ordain and appoint the said James and Benjamin Harrison - my only acting Executors to have full power to receive and pay all just demands against me whatsoever, this being my last Will and Testament revoking and disannulling all others whatsoever - given under my hand and seal the Sixth day of September Eighteen hundred and Thirteen signed sealed and delivered.
