 memory, thanks be to god for the same. And Calling to mind the
 Shortness of Time and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
 die. do make ~~testament~~ this my last will and testament in manner
 And form following first I recommend my soul to God who gave
 it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner according
 to the direction of my Executors hereafter named and as to my worldly
 estate I dispose of that in the following manner. (Item) I gave
 unto my granddaughter Polly Wilson one neg^ro Girl and her increase
 to be freely ~~protest~~ and enjoyed by she and her heirs forever the neg^ro is
 named Amy (Item) I gave and bequeath unto my son Joseph Maclin
 One neg^ro boy named Edmund to be freely ~~protest~~ and enjoyed by him and
 his heirs forever (Item) I lend unto my grandson John S. Maclin
 One neg^ro man named Moses & one fether bed ~~fluminate~~ during his
 natural life to maintain the said John S. Maclin during his life,
 but in case the said John S. Maclin should have a lawful
 legitimate heir of his body my will and desire is that they shall have
 what I have lent to the said John S. Maclin at his death to be freely

Will and desire is that at my death my land and plantation called Leon
know how be sold and the money arising from that sale be equally

forever - (Item) my will and desire is that my negro woman Figg and
her two youngest children Nancy, Sheb share her master or other care to be
hired and the money arising from such sale or hire to be equally divided
