In the name of God amen I Henry Brewer of Drumwicks County in Virginia being unto Court in body but thanks be to god of sound mind memory and with what worldly Goods it hath pleased god to bestow on me in this life I do declare in manner & form following I have given my wife & mine is that my funeral expenses & yet do to be first paid Item I give & bequeath to my Brother John Brewer all my Negroes namely Betty, Lewis, Davy, Sally & Nick during his natural life and at his death my Will & mine is that all the Negroes with their increase be set free Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Deborah Riches one and a fourth of my Furniture to her this being forever Lastly I do nominate and appoint my Brother John Brewer & Mary Brewer my sole & true Executors to the my last Will & Testament nothing all others by me before made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 25th day of April A^D 1802
