This last Will and Testament of Sarah Moore
was framed by the author of John Collier & Thomas Mitchell,
attorneys thereunto and ordered to be recorded. — and on the
motion of Benjamin Moore one of the Executors therein named
he having made Oath thereto according to law and together
with James Fisher, Sir Richard Colman and Thomas Moore
his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of Six hundred Dollars conditioned as the law
directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate
thereof in due form hereby being reserved the other Executor
therin named to join in the same probate when he may
think fit

being of sound memory do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testa-
ment hereby revoking all former Wills hitherto made by me
In nomine. I give to my son in law Robert Harris the following
Slaves (two), a man Fanny Lance Ben Ransamore Indian
Daniel Armisted which said Negroes he has given his possession
with their future increase to him and his heirs forever
Item I give to my Daughter Rebecca Hobbs one negro Woman Castle
and her first Children Evalina Molly Mason & Daniel and
their future increase to her and her heirs forever. Item I give
to my son William Clayton one negro boy Charles one Girl
Sally one Woman Nancy & their future increase to him and
his heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter Martha Harris
one girl Sutha one negro Woman Sardell and their future increase
to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter
Catharine one Woman Pamela Weston Charlotte one Boy Jack
one very sick man and their future one Mansays saddle gun
alms for the use of my Daughters Catharine and Lucy if
they chuse to keep her if not sell her and divide the money
she may take called her mother's share and their future
increase to be used for their funeral expenses for any person
died in their families

Slaves one woman baby one boy an Truny one man & boy
One boy Benjamin by their future future increase the sum of his
heirs forever. Item feather Bed & Furniture. Item I give
to my Daughter Lucy one girl & baby one boy Edmund one
girl Eliza & their future increase to her and her heirs forever
Also one hundred Dollars out of the sale of any Property One
bed and Furniture. Item I leave to my Sister Mary Clayton
one negro man Daniel one Bed and furniture previously
called his bed During her natural life Item I give Daniel unto
my Daughter Lucy Clayton & her heirs forever Item I desire my
Executors make sale of all my personal estate except a room never
hitherto given and devised away and also my Will for the distribution
of my just debts and the balance after the payment of my
debts I desire to be equally divided between my Son John Clayton
Catharine Clayton & Lucy Clayton. My will and desire is that
the Dairy be furnished & the house under finds out of the rent of
the Plantation I do hereby appoint my Son William Clayton
My son in law Robert Harris & Anderson Stock Executors of
this my last will & Testament. Item I claim that my Executors
may not be required to give any security on Qualifying in Writing
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 5th day of November
1851.
