Agreeably to an order of the Worshipful Court of Brunswick to us directed, we have this day Audited, Stated, & Settled the Acc<sup>t</sup>. the Case of an Acc<sup>t</sup>. current of George Atkins Adm<sup>r</sup> of John Sumner dec<sup>d</sup> as above, & by having reference to the former Acc<sup>t</sup>. Current, and an Acc<sup>t</sup>. returned to Court the 24<sup>th</sup> June 1800, we find there is a balance due the Adm<sup>r</sup> of sixteen pounds fifteen Shillings and three pence which as to carry Int<sup>l</sup> from this date until 1<sup>st</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1800 under our hands.
