John Wilson's
Will

In the Name of God Amen. I John Wilson of the County of Brunswick being sick in body, but of sound Sense and memory, do make and Ordain this to be my last will, and Testament, in manner and form as followeth, Viz^t. I lend unto my Daughter Debby Paterson during her life, one Negro woman named Filla, with her Increase, and one Negro Boy named Adam and at her decease I give the said Negro Woman Filla, and said Boy, with the increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I also lend to my Daughter Nancy Ramsey one Negro Girl named Thada & one Negro boy named David, during her life and at her decease, I give the said girl Rhoda & said Boy David, with their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children, to them and their heirs forever, I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Wilson, one Negro man named Gustin, & one Negro girl named Wagon, to him & his heirs forever, I lend unto my Daughter Winifred Wyre, one Negro woman named Suehey & her increase, & one Negro Boy named Ned, during her life, and at her decease, I give the said Turkey & swine, & said Boy Ned, to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever - I give and bequeath to my son Andrew L Wilson one Negro boy named George & one Negro girl named Ana, also one Feather Bed & furniture one Cow & calf one Sow & Pigg to him & his heirs forever, I lend unto my Daughter Sally B Kelley, one Negro woman named Fanny, & her increase, one Negro Boy named Stephen, & one Negro Boy named Tom during her life & at her decease, I give the said Negro Woman Fanny, Stephen & Tom & their increase, to be equally divided, between the whole of her children, to them & their heirs forever - I lend unto my Daughter Polly H. Lorian (during of her life) one Negro Boy named Wily, one Negro Girl named Holly; & one Cow & calf, one Sow & Pigg and at her decease, I give the said Negro Boy Wily, & Negro girl Holly & their increase to be equally divided between the whole of her children to them & their heirs forever, I give and bequeath unto my son John Wilson
