In the name of God amen I Joseph Phipps
of Brunswick County being in reasonable Health and of sound mind
and memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament. - First I commend my soul
into the Hands of God and my Body to the dust to be buried at the
discretion of my Friends: and as to my Worldly estate my will and
desire is as follows vizt I give and bequeath to my son John
Phipps the plantation whereon I now live one Negro man named Peter
five beds and Furniture. Four Head of Horses Two Cows and Calves
Two Hens, and one yoke of Hens, all my Stock of Hogs all my
plantation tools and all my Household and kitchen Furniture that
is not hereafter otherwise disposed of to him & his heirs forever
I give and bequeath to my Grandson John Hanning Horse colt
two years old next August to him & his heirs forever
I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Sally Hanning one
Feather Bed and Furniture and One Cow and Calf to her and her
heirs forever - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Worsley
Twenty five pounds cash to be paid by Executor to her for her portion
My Will and desire is that out of the Remainder of my estate
my Just debt be paid and the balance of them be equally divided
between my two Sons, Benjamin Phipps and John Phipps Lastly I
appoint my son John Phipps my Sole Executor to this my last will
& Testament Given under my Hand and Seal this Twenty first
day of July In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
three Signed & acknowledged
