

In the name of God amen I Lewis Brown of the County
 of Brunswick be in such and weak in Body but of sound mind and
 memory and knowing it is appointed unto man to die do make and declare
 this to be my last Will and Testaments in manner following; and first
 my desire is that after my decease my Executors Collect all debts due ^{me} and
 if the money collected be sufficient to pay all my Just debts, but if they
 will not my desire is that as much of my perishable property as will pay
 all debts Justly due from me should be sold for that purpose Secondly
 I leave to my wife Martha Brown during her life or widowhood my
 lands and plantation whereon I now live and the use of all the fruit trees
 on my old plantation whereon John Brown lives Together with the
 whole of my Estate now in my possession for her maintenance during
 her life or widowhood and after her death or Intermarriage the whole of the
 property lent to my Wife with the Interest and profits arising therefrom
 to go to (and be possessed by my Children agreeable to the language of this
 my Will, Thirdly I give to my two sons David and John Brown my Share
 of Land on Loyds River where they now live to be Equally divided between them
 for ever but my desire is that if my son John should have no Child to
 live lawfully begotten of his body that after his death the Land given
 to him should be sold and Equally divided among all my Children
 fourthly after the death of my Wife or Intermarriage I give to my
 daughter Lacey the Land and said plantation lent to my Wife for ever
 but my desire is if she should die without having any Child lawfully
 begotten of her body that the Land given to her should be sold and
 Equally divided among all my Children, fifthly my Will and desire is
 after the death or Intermarriage of my wife Martha that the whole
 of my Estate lent to my Wife (the Land) Excepted be sold and the
 money arising therefrom be divided among my Children in the following
 manner to wit, Aaron Brown, Richardson, Polly, David, John, Elizabeth,
 Williams, Nancy Digger Frances Morris, Patsy Mark (and Lacey
 to draw the sum of twenty pounds each and also the Children of Mary
 Kelly to draw their Mothers part which would have been the like sum
 of twenty pounds if she had been living and after the above sums of
 twenty is drawn as Expressed above the residue to be Equally divided
 among all my Children to wit, Aaron, David, Richardson, Patsy, David,
 John, Elizabeth, Nancy, Frances, Patsy, Lacey and the Children of
 Mary Kelly the Children of Mary Kelly in any case to be
 entitled to their Mothers part only to them and their Heirs

and I do apoint my three sons Aaron, Lewis and Richardson Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Hereby revoking all others by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this second day of April Eighteen hundred & three Signed Seals Published and declared as and for the last Will and Testament of the above named Lewis Brown, —

Stotter Jacob Miller, Lester Morris, James Duggan, Chaney Williams, & Rolly Brown, their securities entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand Dollars with provision as the law directs Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
