heirs and assigns forever

And on the motion of Mary Parham and William Parham letters of administration with the will annexed is granted them on the said decedent estate they having sworn with those according to law and together with William Hudson Frederick Lewis John Thomas Samuel Harwell and John Harris their securities subscribers and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Fifty thousand dollars with condition as the law directs
