

Brunswick County Court June 22nd 1812

This last Will and Testament of Mary Parker dec^d was proved by the Oaths of William Edw^d Brodnax and Joseph Murrin Witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of John Robinson ^{only} the Executors therein named he having made Oath thereto according to law and together with William Withins and Ambrose Hunt his Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form liberty being reserved the other executor therein named to join in the said probate when he thinks fit.

Mary Parker *Will* In the name of God Amen I Mary Parker of the County of Brunswick and State of Virginia being lawfully minded but of strong mind and memory thus be it that I do for the same do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit

First I give and bequeath to my sons Nathaniel and James W. Parker in equal proportion full and every part of my Probable consisting of Horse Cattle and sheep Household and Kitchen Furniture of every of every kind of the present Crop of every kind with the plantation slaves to them and their heirs forever

Secondly I bequeath all right title or claim to a certain tract of land lying in the County of Middleton and situated here said in the North West Corner of Brunswick to Nathaniel Parker to him and his heirs forever Wholly and lawfully constituted Nathaniel & James W. Parker Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

In Witness whereof I have set my hands and affixed my seal the thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eleven
