beloved, Mely Collier one half more commonly called the Peckmore, one fourth of the same
one small tract to her & her heirs forever. I give & bequeath unto my Grandson
Mathewish Collier, one fourth of the same, one half of the same, one young bay mare
two Yokes of Oxen, all my plantation tools & all the Crops of what kind Cereals that is
growing or will be made on any plantation at my death to him & his heirs forever.
Then lastly my Will & desire is that all Rights of Negro, stock of all kinds that lay in me
at my death should be equally divided at my death between my grand Children Anne
Coranga, Mely Collier & Mathewish Collier, I nominate & appoint my two grandsons
John Coranga, Mely Collier & Mathewish Collier executors to this my last Will & Testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my last true birth day of June
one thousand eight hundred

recorded And on the motion of Mr. Mylly further on & the ex parte therein named the leave was
given both parties according to law together with Robert Kelt his co-counsel entered into
a recognizance a bond in the penalty of One thousand Dollars with condition as the
said motion Certificate is granted leave for Attorneys a proctor thereof in due form
Liberty being required the other ex parte therein named to give within 10 weeks in hand
their bonds &c.

commonly called her to her Wholesome wages. Fourthly I give to my Daughter

the said William & one Elizabeth the said the said is my wife
