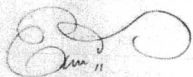

do make and ordain this my last will & testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this
seventh day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight
hundred & Eight. I do hereby give and bequeath to
my loving son John Mason Jordan one leather bed & furniture to
him and his heirs forever. Secondly my will and desire is that the
remainder and residue of my Estate both real & personal of which
kind we be equally divided among my surviving Children and their
heirs Except my Daughter Rebecca Woodward wife of Edmund
Woodward to which said Rebecca Woodward as before mentioned I have
an Equal proportion my Estate with my other Children during her life
and at her death to be Equally divided among her surviving Chil-
dren and their heirs forever. Thirdly I nominate and appoint my
