 I Paul Martwell of the County of Brunswick law in bedding but of sound mind
 full collection do make & declare this my last Will & Testament revoking all
 heretofore made. I give & bequeath unto my son Harrison Martwell the
 tract or tracts of land wherever I now live Reserving to my beloved Mary Martwell
 her life time in the said land to have & use her personal & her Squire & bequeath
 unto my son Amos Martwell the tract of land wherever I now live & the
 negroes he has in his possession that I formerly gave him to have & use forever
 I do give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Martwell one Negro
 called by the name of Moll she my Slave by Deed also a good riding chair
