In the name of God amen I Robert Hicks of Annamie County
being weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory Thanks be to almighty
God for the same. do make this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
1st My soul I give to God who gave it & my body to the earth from whence it came
to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned. 2nd I leave to my
beloved wife Rebecca Hicks the use of all my lands & plantation and four Negroes
to wit, Old Dick & Aggy his wife, Arabus & Kate his wife one feather bed & furniture
two yoke of Oxen two Horses to wit a Black Horse & a second filly, all my house & out
Hoop plantation Tools also all my household & kitchen furniture & all my stock of
hatch except such part thereof as I shall hereafter give & dispose of in the following
legacies during her life or widowhood & after her death in marriage I give to my
sons Paschal Hicks & Abner H Hicks all the lands which I possess to be equally divided
between them in value to them & their heirs forever. 3rd My will & desire is that all
that part of my estate which I have lent to my wife and the part ~~and the part~~ that
I hereafter give to my sons Paschal Hicks & Abner H Hicks be kept together in common
for the support of my wife & her abovesaid sons. 4th My will & desire is that Lucy
Bracey shall not have any other part of my estate than that which she hath already
in possession & having given & bequeathed to my son Hamlen Hicks a proportionable
part of my estate it is my will & desire that he shall have no other part thereof
to give & bequeath unto my son Isaac Hicks Two Negroes to wit, Eph & Brittain &
two Cows. 7 I give unto my son Paschal Hicks Seven Negroes to wit, Dick, Will
Hainnah his wife, Felt, Cott, Davy & Hannah the Bay Horse called Smother
one Gun one feather bed & furniture. 8 I give & bequeath unto my son Abner H
Hicks five Negroes to wit, Simon, Anthony, Nell, Jack & Harry one Horse
Mark Anthony & a Stealing Colt one feather bed & furniture and one Gun
9 My will & desire is that Lotitia Bracey shall have no other part of my estate
than that she now hath in possession 10th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter
Francis James two Negroes to wit, Wilt, & Charlett one feather bed & furniture
11 My will & desire is that all that part of my estate which I heretofore lent
to my wife Rebecca Hicks during her life or widowhood except my Lands
should be equally divided between my three sons Isaac Hicks, Paschal Hicks
& Abner H Hicks. 12th I leave my Daresville both which I had of my son
Isaac Hicks & one second both called Doctor to be sold for the payment of my

just acts and lastly I appoint my true and true Heirs & Personal Heirs & Orphans to this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all other Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 30th day of January Eighteen hundred three

In the name of God amen William Scarbrough of Dorchester County being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner & form as follows I give unto my grand children Sally Williams & Ann Britchell the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to be equally divided between them I give unto my grand children Peyton & Thomas Lloyd children of my Daughter Lucy Lloyd and five pounds current money of Virginia to be equally divided between them I give unto my Daughter Fanny Scarbrough my Negro Girl named Junny to her then & hers forever I give & devise my beloved wife Jane Scarbrough my Negro woman Rachel also all my household & household furniture together with all my stock of Cattle Hogs and my Black Horse for carrying her natural life and after her death I give the said Negro woman and her increase unto my Daughter Fanny Williams & Thomas Scarbrough to be equally divided between them and as to the balance of what I have herein left to my wife at her death after my lawful debts are paid I give it to be equally divided between all my children I give my three Negroes Lydia Charles & David to my four children Thomas William Charles my daughter Sally Lloyd & Fanny Scarbrough after my wife death (if she thinks proper to hold them during her life) and after the said Thomas William Sally & Fanny shall pay ten pounds current money of Virginia unto John I give which I give unto them which I desire should be raised out of the three Negroes last mentioned I testify & certify that I signed my private & secret will & testament of this my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this seventh day of June Anno Domini One thousand eight hundred three
