in my possession during her life and then to be equally divided between my
four younger Children viz: James Wright, Wyatt Wright, Lucy Wright and
Syng Wright. And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and
every other former testament Wills legacies bequests by me made in any wise
before named Willed and Bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no
other to be my last Will & Testament IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this fourteenth Day of February in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and nine
