I Marling Tucker of the County of Brunswick knowing that it is my duty and for all what I do make & constitute this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following I hereby certify that I my wife Mary have during her life in her of done the land whereon been lived & the use of the Water Creek Mill. I also land her during her life the slaves attitud & appurtenances as her done in the slaves which were left by her late husband Thomas Ingram the Reversion of part of which slaves have since purchased. Moreover I give her the following Slaves & property to be hers & as the business to her, Ben. Hanner then two youngest children & all my stock household furniture I give & bequeath to my Brother Martine Tucker my land & plantation sometimes called Policers & sometimes the Whitehouse containing by estimation Three hundred Acres more or less, also sending other track or parcels of land lying on Waqua Creek containing Two hundred forty Acres more or less which said track or parcels of Land purchased of Thomas & Washington Pitt & I also give & bequeath unto him my said Brother Martine Tucker the one half of a track of Land lying on the said Creek & Watonay River purchased by myself & John Tucker of Thomas Simmons containing by estimation five hundred & twenty two Acres more or less all which said track or parcels of Land I give to him my said Brother Martine Tucker & his heirs forever. I also give & bequeath to my said Brother Martine Tucker the following Slaves to wit: Shadrach, Mary, Sam. Saba, Hamlen, Jace, Jerry Tom & B. Sedge, Phoebe, Nina, Rob. Kate, Amy, Jolly Young Child, Weller, Ephraim Moore Ann & Tom the eldest the future increase of the female of them to him the three forever; all the property (including the land whereon I now live or reside) which I have left to my wife Mary Ann during her life

his death I give & bequeath to my said Brother Nathaniel Tucker to
 him & his heirs forever; And I also further give & bequeath all the
 residue of my estate of every kind whatsoever both Real Personal &
 my said Brother Nathaniel Tucker to him & his heirs forever
 I do hereby & appoint my said Brother Nathaniel Tucker executor of
 this my last Will & Testament & desire that my estate may not be
 appraised nor be my said Brother Nathaniel Tucker bound to give
 security for his Executorship As Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & affixed my seal this Twenty Seventh day of April
 in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & five
