In the NAME of GOD AMEN. I Thomas Smith Rives  
In my Study on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of April eighteen hundred and ten remanance  
Oscar has my last Will and Testament to Anne my beloved wife Polley  
Smith all the property I may die possessed and left off for the benefit of her  
Support and to raise and educate my children during her widowhood -  
Except a bed and furniture a piece to my daughter Betty Smith and  
Polley Smith which must be given her at her coming of age or marry.  
In case my beloved wife Polley Smith should marry again then it is my  
Will and desire that she possess during her life one third part of my estate  
The other two thirds of my estate to be divided of waste if they occur profit  
which profit it is my will and desire may go the support and education of  
my youngest child living with me at the time of my death particularly  
Daughter with my youngest child until he daughter Smith arrives at the  
age of eighteen years. then it is my will that the above mentioned two thirds  
of my estate be equally divided between my children and the heirs of their  
Body - William Smith standing enabled to my wife for property given  
him and Richard Moggesson standing enabled likewise for property  
given him. The former forty five dollars and the latter sixty  
dollars and at the death of my beloved wife it is my will in case  
she should marry for the remaining one third of my es-

happen at her death it is my wish that the whole of my estate to be equally  
divided between all my Children and their heirs as above mentioned. And by  
Will Smith should draw their heirs at the above mentioned division

their ~~heirs~~ as William Smith & Richard Waggoner & I leave  
my son John Smith Executor to thy my last will and testament.
