In the name of God Amen I Mary Throckmorth of Brunswick County being sick in body but in sound mind & memory, do hereby make this my last Will & Testament. First I give & bequeath unto my good Daughter Mary Throckmorth my living, Chaise & Furniture to her & hers hers forever. I then give & bequeath unto my Daughter, Mely Collier one half more commonly called the Peckman, one fourth of the furniture & one small lot to her & hers hers forever. I then give & bequeath unto my Grandson Nathaniel Collier, one fourth of the furniture, one half of the one young bay mare two foals of hers, all my plantations Tools & all the crop of what kind I want that is growing or will be made on my plantation at my death to him & his heirs forever. Thus lastly my Will & desire is that all rights of Negro, stock of all kinds that lay in me not herebefore mentioned do be equally divided at my death between my grand children Anne Coraqua, Mely Collier & Nathaniel Collier. I nominate & appoint my two grandsons John Coraqua, Mely Collier & Nathaniel Collier executors to this my last Will & Testament. And I hereby certify that I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this tenth day of June one thousand eight hundred

This last Will & Testament of Mary Throckmorth was proved by the oath of David Meredith a Justice of the Peace & having been read on the 27th day of October last by the Court of Spencer Neely and the entire contents thereof are ordered to be recorded and in the action of Mely Collier one of the executors therein named to have my niece both thirds according to law together with Robert Will be jointly entitled unto & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars with provision as the law directs. Certificate is granted herefor attesting a probate thereof in due form & Liberty being required the other executors therein named to give public & private as here they stand fully
