I William Baugh of Brunswick County being in good health  
and in perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality  
of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain  
that my last Will & Testament that is to say principally effect of all I good & lawfull  
my soul into the hands of the Almighty God that gave it my body I recommend to his  
merciful hands to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor hoping at  
the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as  
touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life  
I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following manner & form.

I Give my whole estate in Land Negroes Servants cattle, Hogs & Sheep together with  
Household goods and all movable effects whatsoever to be equally divided amongst my two  
brothers and two sisters namely James Baugh, David Baugh, Martha Curton and Elizabeth  
going to them and their heirs forever to be possessed with the same at the time of my decease  
I do hereby appoint my two brothers James Baugh and David Baugh, my whole  
and sole executors of this my last Will & Testament and I do hereby utterly deny all other  
wills executors & Assigning and confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament

This last Will & Testament of William Baugh said above

is well acquainted with the hand writing of James Harrison another subscribing witness thereto and  
only believes the said name that subscribing is in the proper hand writing of the said James  
Harrison and the said being thereof satisfied the said Court is ordered to be recorded and on the  
return of James Baugh administrator with the will annexed is granted him on the said said  
said he having made oath thereunto according to law and together with James Harrison (S)  
and James Harrison his security entered into and acknowledged above in the presence of  
the Court as the law directs for the cause & faithful  
of the said decedent's estate
