 as followeth. first of all I commend my Soul to god who gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors Whosoever named and as touching such worldly Goods as it has been please god to bless me with. I give and dispose in the following manner (To wit) I give and bequeath my will and desire is that my Just debts be first paid. I then Give and bequeath unto my son David Hudson (one Negro woman by the name of Sarah and her husband Increase also one Servant man to him This last forever. I then) I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Gusham one Negro woman by the name of Sally and all her future increase to her and her heirs forever. I then I give and bequeath unto my son Robert one Negro woman by the name of James also one Negro girl child (daughter of negro Sally) to him and his heirs forever. I then to my wife by the name of Sarah I leave together with all the rest of my Personal estate Not here before given to the said and the money arising from such sale after paying my Just debts to be Equally divided Between my son David and my daughter Elizabeth Gusham and my son Robert Hudson. Lastly. I do nominate and appoint Mr. Gusham and my son Robert Hudson Executors of this my last will and Testament.
