of the same chests Trunkes and every other articles and all my other
property which has not before given. And Lastly I appoint my loving
friend James Sumford my executor and my loving wife Sally Johnson
Executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I
have set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of June
1808 Eight.
