In the name of God amen I William Moore of the County of Brunswick and State of Virginia Being sick of body but of perfect mind and Memory but fearing to mind the Mortality of Body do make here and ordain this my last will and Testament as followeth, I leave to my Wife Sarah Moore all my Estate that is in my Possession during her life and at her Death I give Elizabeth King Twenty Dollars - I give and bequeath unto Benjamin Moore my grandson Fifty pounds. I give and bequeath unto Benjamin Moore my son one half the tract of land I now live on at the death of my Wife. I leave

I give unto my Daughter Nanny Moore the other half of my land (and my two Negroes Lea, and Merri to her and her heirs forever after the death of wife, also one feather bed which she is to take choice of all I have. I do hereby constitute appoint and ordain Benjamin Moore Nanny Moore and Richard Coleman Whole and sole Executors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament Revoking all other Will's and testaments made by me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day of November 1865. -

This last Will & Testament of William Moore dec'd was proved by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto & ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of Benjamin Moore one of the executors therein appointed he having made oath thereto according to Law & together with William H. Harper & Nathaniel Harper his securities entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars with condition as the Law directs to certify & grant him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form liberty being reserved the other executors therein named to join in the same probate when they think fit -
