I amprimarily all my debts are to be punctually paid, and the legacies herein after bequeathed, are to be discharged as soon as circumstances will permit, and in the manner directed. NOW I give and bequeath to my Son John Jones the tract of Land whereon he now lives lying in Sussex County containing seven hundred and twenty seven acres, and the four following named Negroes that he has in his possession (to wit) Sam, Elwin, Hannah & Mary to him his heirs and assigns forever. NOW I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Maclain one tract of Land called Kings tract containing three hundred and thirty three acres, and one other tract that my Wife Lotely Purchased of William Adams, both lying in Brunswick County and the four following named Negroes that she has in her possession (to wit) James, Lewis, Will and Lizza, to her and her heirs and assigns forever.
