 Abraham Buxton Planter of Brunswick County Virginia being  
 weak of Body but thanks be to God but of Sound and perfect  
 memory as usual in health but knowing that it is appointed  
 for all men once to die do make this my last Will and Testament  
 in manner and form as following (viz) It is my Will that my just  
 Debts shall be justly paid I do hereby give to my wife Anne  
 Buxton my Plantation with my sole and whole Estate both real  
 and personal to her and her Heirs forever It is my Will that  
 no one Child nor Grand Child nor Relation of any kind live  
 with her to be a trouble to her person or a charge to the Estate  
 other ways than by a Visit for three or four Days or a week It is  
 my Will that she gives no Gifts to no one to hurt the Estate and  
 that she sells nothing of Cattle Hogs Horses or Household  
 Goods without knowledge of one of my Executors all this in

good knowledge of one of my Executors all this in  
order to keep what little she has together to make her own life  
as comfortable as she can and I do hereby Nominate constitute  
and appoint Jehu Peebles Senr. and James Macdon Senr. my  
Executors and I do hereby make null and void all former Will  
by me heretofore made and do hereby pronounce this my last  
Will and Testament.
