Will.

In the name of God Amen the seventeenth Day of January
1749 I Abraham Phenix of the parish of Saint Andrews and County
of Brunswick being Sick and weak in Body but of perfect Mind and
Memory thanks be given to God for the same therefore calling to Mind
the Mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all Men
once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in
manner following Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Cordilla Robinson one Shilling to she and her Heirs forever Item I give
and bequeath to my Daughter Barbara Phenix one Shilling to she and
her Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Phenix one
Shilling to him and his Heirs forever Item I send to Mary Harris Jun^r
during her natural Life all my Land whereon I now live Item all the
rest of my Estate I give to Mary Harris Jun^r and her Heirs forever
I make and Ordain constitute and Appoint Capt Sewelling Jones
my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament utterly
disannulling and revoking all other Wills by me made In witness
