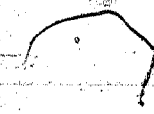


In the name of God Amen I Andrew Smith

this Declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as followeth first that all my debts be paid I give and
bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Smith one
year's Food named Parker to her and her Heirs forever. Item I give
and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth one cow and six ten
pence which is marked of my pasture mark to her and her Heirs
forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife
Elizabeth and mine all the Remainder part of my Estate that I now
own or shall in to her and her Heirs forever and I do hereby appoint
my friends John Dunst and Thomas Higgo Executors of
this my last Will and Testament in full right whereof
I am the author and ratify this with my hand and seal this 10th day of May 1769
