In the Name of God Amen. I Anne Hipper
of the County of Brunswick being very Sick and weak
in Body but in perfect Sense and memory do make this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form as
follows, viz^t, I give and Bequeath my Soul into the
Hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my Body
to the Earth it Mother to be Buried at the discretion of
my Executors and as for such Estate as it hath Pleased
God for to bless me with I give and Devise in manner and
form as follows. Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son
John Hipper two cows and calves four Head of Hogs
and all the crop of corn that is made upon the Plantation
two Locks and Keys. Item I give and bequeath unto
my Son Alexander Hipper my Bed and Furniture.
Item I give unto my Son James Hipper one cow and

my Son Alexander Nipper my Bed and Furniture.

Item I give unto my Son James Nipper one Cow and
half one Heifer. Item I give unto my Son in Law
Richard Pottingberry one Shilling Sterling to the intent
that he may have no more of my Estate. Item I give
unto my Son in Law Thomas Westmoreland one Shilling
Sterling to the intent that he may have no more of my
Estate. Item I give unto my Son in Law William Jinks
one Shilling Sterling that he may have no more
Right to any more of my Estate. Item that all the rest of
my Personal Estate after my Charges is paid I give unto
my Son John Nipper. Item I Give and Bequeath unto
my Neighbour Randall Bracey my now Dwelling
Plantation the contents or quantity of Land that was given
to me by my Husband John Nipper's last Will made in the
Twenty Sixth Day of March one Thousand seven Hundred

and thirty six and I do constitute and appoint my Son
John Nipper my whole Executor of this my last Will
Revolving all former Will by me made as witness my

Hand this sixth Day of October 1752.

At a court held for Brunswick County the 24. Day of October 1752. This Will was presented in court by John Nipper the Executor therein named who made Oath thereto and was proved by the Oaths of Dorothy Robertson and Mary Bracey witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded and Certificate granted the said Executor for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form he having with Daniel Carrell his Security entered into and acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of five hundred Pounds with condition according to Law.
