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Daniel In the name of God Amen I Daniel Jackson Son of Brunswick
Jacksons County an Saint Andrews Parish be Sick & Weak but in perfect sense &
Will Memory Thanks be to the Almighty therefore and doth make this my Last Will
and Testament hereby Revoking all other Wills heretofore by me made and for
what worldly Goods which it hath pleased God to bestow on me after the payment
of my funeral Charges & my just Debts paid I bestow and dispose of as followeth
Item I give unto my well beloved Son Nathan Jackson the Plantation that I now
live on with four hundred Acres of Land and all the improvements thereunto belonging
to him and his Heirs or Assigns for ever only my beloved wife Bathiah Jackson to
have the use of it during her Life or Widowhood Item I give unto my loving
Wife and to my Children my Negro Man named Mingo to them and their
Heirs or Assigns for ever only she to have the use of him during her Life or
Widowhood also I give to my beloved Wife Bathiah Jackson one Side Saddle
which was called hers to her and her Heirs or Assigns for ever Item I give unto

have the use of it during her life or Widowhood Item I give unto my loving

Wife and to my Children my Negro Man named Mingo to them and their

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Heir or Assigns for ever only she to have the use of him during her life or

Widowhood also I give to my beloved Wife Bathiah Jackson one Side Saddle

which was called her to her and her Heir or Assigns for ever Item I give unto

my beloved Wife Bathiah Jackson Ho all my Children all my Household Goods

and all my Stock of Cattle Horses & Hogs to be equally divided betwixt my

beloved Wife and my Children they paying all my just Debts and Funeral

Charges unto them and their Heir or Assigns for ever Item I do appoint my

Brother John Jackson and my Wife Bathiah Jackson Executors of this my last

Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and

Print my Seal this 1th Day of May 1760

Securities entered into and Acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of five

Hundred Pounds with Conditions according to Law.
