In the name of God Amen I David Cummins of Brunswick County be weak in Body but sound in Mind and Memory Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth Item I give my Soul into the Hands of my blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ in hopes of a glorious Resurrection and my Body to Buried as my Executors shall think proper Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Frances Cummins my Plantation whereon I live and to her Heirs also I give my loving Wife five Cows and Yearlings and all the Remainder of my Personal Estate after my just Debts are paid Only a Cow and Yearling and Horse Colt named Rubey I give unto my Son David Cummins and my Will and desire is that my loving Wife may give no Security And do Ordain and Appoint my loving Wife my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament as witness my Hand and Seal this nineteenth Day of May 1748.
