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In the Name of God Amen Elizabeth Hicks
of the Parish of Saint Andrews in the County of Brunswick
being weak in body but of a sound perfect disposing mind &
memory thanks Given to God for the same and calling to mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for
all persons once to die do make and Ordain this my Last will
Testament in manner and form following hereby Revoking all
other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made First I
Commend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my
body I Commend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian
manner by my Executors hereafter Named and as touching the
Disposition of all such Temporal Estates and hath been
pleased almighty God to bestow upon me I give devise and
Disprove thereof as followeth Inprimis I will that my
Debt and funeral Expenses be duly paid and discharged.
Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Margrised Hicks
one Negro fellow Named Peter and the Old Sorell horse and vide

Debt and funeral expences be duly paid and discharged.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Maryfred Hicks

one Negro fellow Named Peter and the Old Sorrell horse and vide Saddle and the best featherbed and all the furniture belonging to it one oval Table and the Chest that was called mine and six head of cattle that went by the Name of the one and a

Looking Glass Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hicks and Martha Hicks one featherbed each one

Chest a piece one Square Table a piece and five Pounds a piece to be paid out of the crop now on the ground and furniture to the beds before mentioned Item I give and bequeath to my two Daughters

Sarah Hicks and Mary Hicks one featherbed each with one New Rugg and one New Blanket to each and one Cabbard a piece and

one Iron pot a piece Item I give and Bequeath to my son Nathaniel

Hicks all my Goods and Chattels both Real and Personal which are not herein given to and disposed of and do hereby nominate

and appoint my son Nathaniel Hicks and Samuel Brown my full and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament IN WITNESS
