of all such Temporal Estates as it hath been pleased Almighty God to
bestow upon me I give Devise and Dispose thereof as followeth

Imprimis I will that my Debts and Funeral Expences be duly
paid and Discharged Item I give and bequeath to my Dear beloved
wife Salyanah Harris my Negro fellow named Fortain and my Negro
wench named Hannah to her and her heirs and assigns forever

 named Kate and her Issue shall fall to my wife Lulyanah Harris to belong
 to her and her heirs and assigns forever and in case my Daughter should

will and Testament **IN WITNESS** hereof I have set my hand
and affixed my seal this 19th of November 1744.
