Brunswick do constitute and ordain this as my last
Will & Testament in Manner & Form following
that is to say after my Debts and funeral Expences
are paid I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife
Frances Walker the Use of all my Estate to enable
her to bring up my Children until my Children
Man or come to the Age of twenty one Years at
which Time they are to receive their Respective Parts
hereafter mentioned and such Part of the Profits
as is over and above sufficient for the Maintenance
of my said Wife and Children to be laid out in the
Purchase of a small Piece of Land and building
thereon sufficient House for my Wife to live in.

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Son Alexander
Walker that Part of Land on Meherrin River that
lyeth below Walle Creek including the Plantation
where I now live containing about seven hundred
Acres be the same more or less to him the said
Alexander and his Heirs forever

Imp^o. I give and bequeath to my son Tho^s. Belford
Walker that Part of my Land on Meherrin River
that lyeth above Walle Creek containing about
seven hundred and Ninety two Acres be the same

more or less to him the said Thos. Belfrage and his
Heirs for ever - In Test: it is my Will and Desire that
my Executors sell my land in Dinwiddie County -
bought of my Brother Jas. Walker and the money
arising from such to be made use of in paying
my Debts and purchasing the land before mentioned
In Test: it is my Will and Desire that when either of
Children have a right to Demand their respective parts
of my Estate that then all my Negroes and other Estate
not before mentioned be equally divided between my
beloved Wife and Children at the Discretion of my
Executors without making a Sale of my said Estate
it is also my Desire my estate be not appraised
I do appoint my beloved Wife and my Brother Robert
and David Walker Executors to this my last Will -
