and Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in Manner
and form following Inprimis I Give and Bequeath unto
my son John Walton and his heirs or assigns forever all
the upper part of the Tract of Land whereon I now live
that Belongs to me that lies on both Sides of Quarral Swamp
above that line made in presence of Burall bats George
Walton Junr. and Thomas Walton Beginning at a Red Oak
Tree Just by Redbatters old path afore Taff Tree of My out
Side line and so along a line of marked trees to a
Small Red Oak on the Swamp Side and up the Various Courses
and to the various Courses of the said white oak Swamp
of the said Swamp to the Mouth of Whites oak Swamp to Richard
Redbatters line Also one Negro Man named Saml

that belongs to me that lies on both sides of Luanek Swamp
above that line made in presence of Burce bats ^{Brunswick County, Virginia Wills} George ¹⁷⁶⁹
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Walton Junr and Thomas Walton Beginning at a Red Oak
Tree next by Adbitters old path afore Taff Tree of My out
Side line and so along a line of harked trees to a
Small Red Oak on the Swamp Side and up the Various Courses
and to the various Courses of the said white oak swamp
of the said Swamp to the Mouth of White oak Swamp to Rich
adbiters line Also one Negro Man Named buff and one
Negro Women Named Mary and all the Children of the said
Negro Mary to him his Heirs or assigns forever Item I give
and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Adbitter One Hundred
pounds back to be paid to her after the Death of my loving
wife Elizabeth Walton by My Executors Item I give and
bequeath unto Adam Simms junr One Shilling Sterling to be
paid by My Executors Item I give and bequeath unto my

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Daughter Catharine Morris One Negro Named Isaac to her and her
Heirs or Assigns forever I give and bequeath unto my Son Isaac
Now Walton Two Negro Men one Named Matt and the Other Named
James and after the Death of my loving wife Elizabeth Walton the
Residue of my lands not heretofore given to him and his Heirs
or Assigns forever I lend unto my loving wife Elizabeth Walton
the Residue of my Estate not heretofore given and I give and bequeath
unto her the profits of the same to her to Dispose of as She Shall
think fit During her life and after her Death it is my Desire that
all my last Estate let it be of ^{what} kind or Quality soever be sold and
Equally Divided between my two Sons John and Isaac Now
Walton and I do appoint my two Sons and my Executors of
this my last Will and Testament to execute all other Wills
heretofore made or Intended to be Made by me and it is my
Desire that my Executors owe No Duty No No part of it

to be appraised but disposed of as above
