In the Name of God Amen. I Henry Seabetter of
Brunswick County in Virginia knowing the uncertainty
of human life and being now in perfect mind and memory
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following. Item I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Elizabeth Walton one Mulatto girl named
Lucy with all her increase and one Negro boy named
Hercules to her and her heirs or assigns forever. Item
I give and bequeath to my son Charles Seabetter one Negro
woman named Molly and all her increase and one
Negro boy named James to him and his heirs or assigns
forever and one white man. Item I give and bequeath
to my son Henry Seabetter two Negro boys named Abrah
and Isaac.

in Manner and form following. Item I give and bequeathth
to my Daughter Elizabeth Walton one Mulatto Girl named
Lucy with all her increase and one Negro Boy named
Hercules to her and her heirs or Assigns forever. Item
I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Sedbetter one Negro
Woman named Moll and all her increase and one
Negro Boy named James to him and his heirs or Assigns
forever and one Whipsaw. Item I give and bequeath
to my Son Henry Sedbetter two Negro Boys named Abrahm
and Gato to him and his heirs or Assigns forever. Item
I give and bequeath to my Son Brury Sedbetter one Negro
Boy named Daniel and one Negro Girl named Annaca
with all her increase to him and his heirs or Assigns

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forever. I also give him two hundred and forty acres of land
by Patent whereon I now live and a survey of four
hundred acres adjoining to it to him and his heirs or
assigns forever only leaving my loving Wife Edith
Leadbetter the use of it during her life or ^{all} Maonhood. Item
I give to my loving wife Edith Leadbetter the residue of
my Estate not heretofore mentioned be it of what nature or
quality soever lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint
my loving Wife Edith Leadbetter and Isaac Ross Walton
Executrice and Executors of this my last Will and Testament
hereby Revoking and Disanulling all Wills by me here-
tofore made as Witnes my hand this twenty third day
of September in the year of our Lord Christ 1749.
