

In the name of God Amen April 5th 1784 James Fisher of the

parish of Saint Andrews and County of Brunswick being of perfect sense and memory do
make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner as I here following

My WM I Give and Bequeath unto my loving son William Fisher the following
Negroes which he has now in possession viz Fanny Tom Crabbe, Buba and all her Children
them and their Increase and the Land whereon he now lives containing four hundred and

Ninety five Acres to him and his heirs forever.

WM I Give and Bequeath unto my loving son Jonathan Fisher the upper part of the Land lying
above the Spring branch beginning at a great Red Oak that's along my back path and
thence a straight course to the said Branch thence down the said Branch to Whinn Creek
thence up the said Creek to Steth's line thence along Steth's line to the big oak and to

half of my Great Mill to him and his heirs forever.

WM I Give and Bequeath to my loving son James Fisher the Land below my stone house to
him and his heirs forever and the Parcel I bought of Thomas Bishop

from the Spring branch beginning at a great Red Oak tree above my house
thence a straight course to the south & then down the road to the Spring branch

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thence up the road back to Heth's line thence along Heth's line to the beginning of the
half of my great Mill to turn windmills near over

Item I give and bequeath to my loving son James Fisher the Land below my standing house
and the Land I bought of Charles Gordon and the Land I bought of William Bishop
with the following Negroes Namely: Ball, Salt and all their children & their increase
with one feather Bed and furniture with the half of the Mill to turn & his heirs forever
And if my son James Fisher should die without a lawful heir my Will & Desire is
that my Grand son James Fisher the son of Jonathan Fisher may have the above
mentioned Lands and the half of the Negroes above mentioned Negroes to him his
heirs forever and the other half of the Negroes my Will & Desire is that my Grand
son Ben Fisher the son of William Fisher may have to him & his heirs forever
Item I send into my loving son James Fisher my Land & plantation which I own

two during her Widowhood with three Negroes Daphney, Grace, Jacob & James and
Billy and two feather beds and furniture with household a Kitchen furniture
with twelve head of Cattle two work horses stock of hogs, swine and of Sheep.

Item I lend unto my loving Daughter Constant Lucas two Negroes namely
Hall, Jane. During her natural life and then to be equally divided among all her
Children to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Daughter Clara Wilson one Negro named
David to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Daughter Martha Edridge one Negro named
Kidon and Judah to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Daughter Sarah Fisher one Negro named
Reuben and Bob with one feather Bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever.

The Rest of my Negroes named Sam, Lucy & Sarah may be equally divided among
the rest of my Children namely Elizabeth Edwards, Nancy Richardson, Susanna

Killer and the Negro that I have lent to my wife named Billy after her decease to
be equally divided after my just debts are paid And if my Daughter Sarah Fisher
should die without a lawful heir the survivors to enjoy the Estate given To William
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the Day & Year above written. Signed
Tested published & pronounced by the said James Fisher as his last will and
Testament. Lastly I do witness my son William Fisher & Jonathan Fisher
Executors to this my last will and Testament.
