Mare to be which she shall please to make choice of out of any that is properly
Part of my Estate also one saddle Bridle I also give in like sort to my foresaid
Wife Agnes ten head of Cattel such as she shall choose out of any that shall at
the Time of my Death be properly Part of my Estate my Will and Desire is
that after my said Wife shall have taken her Part of the Cattel and Horses
Mares that whatever of either kind ^{shall} be left be given & I hereby give & bequeath
them all entirely to the forementioned John Symon I also give & Bequeath all
my Hogs to my forementioned Wife

Item I give & bequeath to my foresaid Wife Agnes all my Household Goods of
what kind or sort soever they be And of this my last will and Testament I do
Nominate constitute and ^{ordain} appoint my foresaid loving Wife as my whole & sole
Excutrix and Receiver and that former Will or Wills by me heretofore made
I make ^{by} void & detain this as my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty ninth Day of September in the Year
of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and forty six

Witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded and Certificate granted the said Executrix for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form she having with John Speer her Security entered into and acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of two hundred and fifty Pounds with Condition According to Law.
